F. Old Business-

- a. Family Day- Jay Morgan- 6/10/23. Trying to get responses from membership has been tough. Only 22 people responded to the survey. Pop up tents will be needed for the event
- b. Fire Prevention Exam (seniority points)- St. Pierre- By Contract, Admin needed to post the cost/ test 90 days out. - b. Resolution to 2022 and 2023 Arbitration- Steve- Personnel Matter so details will not be discussed. A member was injured and filed for IOD. The claim was denied by the town and the Board filed for arbitration. Went to the first hearing. It was unknown but the board felt confident about the hearing. For the first and only day of arbitration, it cost the Union \$9,061.05 (AAA costs, stenographer, expert witness, attorney etc). Everyone says just grieve it, but it does cost a lot of money. It cost the town almost \$15,000.00. We had day 2 and 3 scheduled, but the Board sat down with the town and came to an agreement. The deal was to get the person to retirement. Pension credits were purchased and split by 3. The town purchased ½, the member purchased ½, and the Union gave a loan of \$5,643.62 to the member. A promissory note was written up by our lawyer for 5 years. The member has been making monthly payments to the union. The arbitration case Was not brought up till now because the member had not officially retired.
- c. Station 1 Grill- Wilson- Need approval for new grill- \$1,029. Motion made by Bonneau to spend up to \$1,100.00 for a new grill. Seconded by Murray- Motion carries.
